

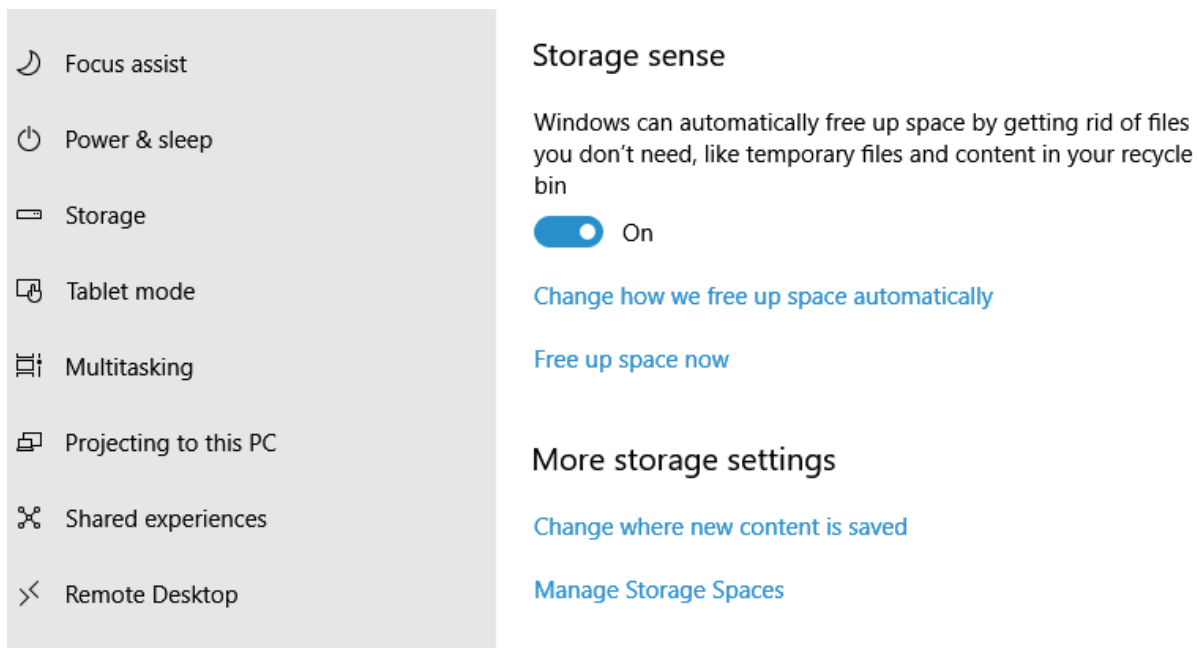
CLEAN UP YOUR HARD DRIVE AUTOMATICALLY

You can make sure that you have plenty of available space on your hard drive by getting rid of old files that you no longer need, including temporary files and other stuff.

Let Storage Sense Clean Your Drive Automatically

Windows 10 users have the luxury of using Storage Sense, a handy feature that automatically cleans out your temporary files and recycle bin of things that have been hanging around for over a month. Storage Sense was added to Windows 10 in the Creator's Update 1703 (Spring, 2017), and it's a great tool for automatically cleaning things up safely. It's pretty conservative about what it deletes, so you shouldn't run into any problems leaving it turned on.

To get to it, go to Settings (Windows key + I) > System > Storage, and turn on the toggle switch in the "Storage Sense" section.



Click on "Change how we free up space" link right under the toggle to adjust settings.
