

FIND THE IP (Internet Protocol) ADDRESS OF YOUR ROUTER

There may a time when you need to change your router settings. And to do that you probably have to enter its IP address into a web browser. But if you don't know what that address is, exactly, then Windows can help you find it.

1. Open a Command Prompt window by typing **cmd** in the search box.
2. Then type **ipconfig/all** and press the Enter key.
3. Scroll down the list that appears and look for the network adapter that is connected to your router.
4. Note its Default Gateway setting, which is usually the router address.
