Snap Four Windows to a Grid

Windows 10 gives you the ability to snap four windows at a time in a $2 \ge 2$ grid. To snap a window in a $2 \ge 2$ (two across and two down) grid with the mouse, drag and drop it into one of the four corners of the screen. Drag-and-drop several windows in this way to get your $2 \ge 2$ grid of open windows.

You can combine the Windows+left/right/up/down arrows to snap a window into a quadrant of your screen. For example, press Windows+left arrow to snap a window into the left half of your screen; then press Windows+up arrow to snap it into the top-left quadrant. You can use any layout up to 2×2 . For example, you could have one tall window on the left and two short ones on the right. Or you could have one wide window on top and two narrow ones on the bottom.
