

MANAGING YOUR MEDIA AUTOPLAY FUNCTION

Windows has a tendency to try to anticipate what will please you and then barrel ahead. For example, Autoplay allows you to change the way Windows handles the media files it detects on a device with removable storage, such as a digital camera, CD, DVD, or Thumb Drive. As a result, when Windows detects music tracks on your CD drive, it can automatically play the tracks or it can allow you to view them in a folder.


This can get annoying, especially if you are dealing with a bunch of picture CDs and Windows keeps asking you what program you want to use in order to open those picture files. If you don't want Windows to second-guess what you want to do with your CDs, DVDs or Thumb Drives, you can disable the AutoPlay function.

- 1 Press Windows + X.
- 2 Click Control Panel.
- 3 Click on Hardware and Sound (in Category View).
- 4 Click Autoplay. The window will look something like this
