

TURN THE KEYBOARD NUMBER LOCK ON

If you access your Microsoft account by using a four-digit pin, you probably know that it's best to have the NumLock turned on. Otherwise, you will need to remember to tap the NumLock key every time you want to access your pin number.

Standard warning: Registry Editor is a powerful tool and misusing it can render your system unstable or even inoperable. This is a pretty straight-forward hack and as long as you stick to the steps, you shouldn't have any problem.

Follow these steps to open the Registry Editor:

1. Press Windows+R on your keyboard.
2. Type *regedit* in the search box and press Enter.
3. Click *yes* at User Account Control.

Navigate to the following key in the left column:

(Note: You only need to make this change once.)

Expand **HKEY_USERS**

Go down the list to find and Expand **DEFAULT**

Go down the list to find and Expand **CONTROL PANEL**

Go down the list to find and Expand **KEYBOARD**

Go down the list to find and open **InitialKeyboardIndicators**

Set the value to **2**.

Close regedit and reboot the computer to have this change take place.
