

QUICKTIME FOR WINDOWS: UNSAFE AT ANY SPEED

There are two good reasons to uninstall QuickTime for Windows if you have it on your computer. First, Apple has ended all support for it, including security patches. (QuickTime for Apple products is still supported.) Second, two unpatched critical vulnerabilities were discovered in QuickTime in 2005 and Apple is not going to fix them.

Even QuickTime for Mac hasn't seen a major new version since 2009. Apple long ago gave up on its quest to make QuickTime's MOV format the video file standard. But some programs still use it.

The Movies & TV application that comes preloaded in Windows 10 will open MOV files.
